




From The President's Desk......


MEMBER SPOTLIGHT.....

The "Member Spotlight" takes us to Comstock Park, Michigan for the month of January. An area 40 miles inland from Lake Michigan, Comstock Park is a suburb of Grand Rapids. In this location one can enjoy the natural wonders of the Grand River Basin and the excitement of a big-city with small town flavor. *Field & Stream* Magazine named the Grand Rapids area...the nation's sixth best fishing city. You can hook salmon and steelhead in the middle of downtown. Our visit, however, centers specifically on a northwest suburb called the "Park". The "Park" is home to MCPCA member, *Chris Musson*. **Chris** who is a HR Coordinator with Metro Health Hospital shares a home with her nephew, Eric, her two dogs and two cats.



Along with her busy schedule as a HR Coordinator, Chris keeps active with Grand Rapids Kennel club and Mid Michigan Poodle Club activities.

She told us for this interview...."I have always had innate love for animals, especially dogs. Reading every dog and horse book I could get my hands on. Ever since I can remember, when asked "what do you want for your birthday, Christmas", the answer was always a dog.



After Tippy, our family had a boxer female (Midge), and later another setter mix (Freckles). In my late 20's I had a Chihuahua mix (Duchess).

In my early 30's I decided I wanted an AKC show quality dog. I had narrowed my field down to Labrador Retriever

(Old Yeller), Springer Spaniel, Standard Poodle and Airedale Terrier.

The Airedale Terrier won. (Photos above and right) I pointed **Marydale's Melody of Joy** with her being shown by her breeder/handler. She later earned her C.D. Melody lived to be 13 years old.



My first AKC Champion was **Melody's** son **,Ch. Mistyaire's Lancer of Tiger.** (Melody & Lancer pictured left)

I had bred Melody to the top Airedale at that time.

Lancer died at age 6 due to a rare growth on the pituitary gland. When **Lancer** died, something in me died too. He was that special soul mate.

I took a 25 year break and just had pets.

My first Standard was a Blue girl (**Meg**) who lived to be 13. (pictured below left) I then rescued a border lab mix

(Lady Jane) who followed Meg and I home from a walk. She is currently 13 ½. I then adopted/rescued a 9 year old Standard White girl (**Zoie**) and she lived to be 13 (pictured below right-she was another soul mate). Around this time I decided to look for an adult poodle to join my family. I contacted Gina and Lina from Rivers Edge/Mozaic Standard







Poodles to inquire if they had any adult poodles available for rehoming. They said "no" and then asked if I had ever thought about fostering a standard poodle. This would mean I would be able to have a "puppy" join my family! I would also be able to share in the excitement of once again raising, training and showing a quality dog.



I then made the decision to foster also due to my own health concerns. I felt content in the knowledge that if at anytime I became unable to continue caring for this particular poodle...it could return back to live with Gina and Lina. I made arrangements to meet with Gina and Lina at the Apple Blossom Cluster Shows to see some of their poodles in person. At that time I gave them my wish list of what I dreamed of in a poodle. I wanted a white male. They told me that they were planning to purchase a male pup from an upcoming AKC Ch sired litter. The mother of the litter was going to be a UKC Ch parti poodle. This somewhat stunned me......I always thought the "parti poodles" were just designer dogs connected with people trying to make a buck. But after some education from Gina and Lina,...I came to understand some of the history of parti poodles and their struggle in the poodle world. I told them that yes I would be interested in a pup from the upcoming litter and so my wait began.

In January of 2010 I learned that my puppy was in the oven.....Oh how excited I was. Gina and Lina let me be involved in the naming process...so I scoured baby name books for my favorite "boy" names......Together we agreed upon the name "Trace."

When the litter was born....there was only one BLUE boy. So I did not get my white....I got a Blue © (Trace) and I love him to death. Gina and Lina invited me to come to the Birch Run, MI shows where they had planned on picking up their/our new boy. I was so excited to finally get that boy into my arms. My reasons for joining MCPCA was and is to support the movement to recognize all colors of poodles, and to help AKC recognize the value of the different colors by our collective efforts in educating the public. 

PRACTICAL POODLE POSTSCRIPT.....

Winter Skin & Paw Care Tips

Exposure to winter's dry, cold air and chilly rain, sleet and snow can cause chapped paws and itchy, flaking skin, but these aren't the only discomforts poodles can suffer. Winter walks can become downright dangerous if chemicals from ice-melting agents are licked off of bare paws.



During the winter, products used as de-icers on sidewalks and other areas can lead to trouble for our poodles, potentially causing problems ranging from sore feet to internal toxicity. Pet parents should take precautions to minimize their poodle's exposure to such agents.

To help prevent cold weather dangers from affecting your poodle's paws and skin, please consider the following tips:

- *Repeatedly coming out of the cold into the dry heat can cause itchy, flaking skin. Keep your home humidified and towel dry your poodle as soon as he or she comes inside, paying special attention to his feet and in between the toes.
- *Trim hair to minimize the clinging of ice balls, salt crystals and de-icing chemicals that can dry on the skin. (Don't neglect the hair between the toes!)
- *Bring a towel on long walks to clean off stinging, irritated paws. After each walk, wash and dry your poodle's feet to remove ice, salt and chemicals—and check for cracks in paw pads or redness between the toes.
- *Bathe your poodles as little as possible during cold spells. Washing too often can remove essential oils and increase the chance of developing dry, flaky skin. If your poodle must be bathed, use a moisturizing shampoo and/or rinse.
- *Booties help minimize contact with painful salt crystals, poisonous anti-freeze and chemical ice-melting agents. They can also help prevent sand and salt from getting lodged in between bare toes, causing irritation.
- *Massaging petroleum jelly into paw pads before going outside helps to protect from salt and chemical agents. And moisturizing after a good toweling off helps to heal chapped paws.
- *Our poodles burn extra energy by trying to stay warm in wintertime, sometimes causing dehydration. Feeding your poodle a little bit more during the cold weather and making sure he or she has plenty of water to drink will help to hydrate your poodle, and their skin should be less dry.

Remember, if the weather's too cold for you, it's probably too cold for your poodle. All animal companions should remain indoors as much as possible during the winter months and never be left alone in vehicles when the mercury drops. If you spot wounds or redness on your pet's feet, please contact your veterinarian immediately.
