AKC Performance Brags

Chase finished his Obedience Masters 2 title! He's now UCDX UCH JC Pioneer Shadow Chaser UDX2 OM2 RAE VCX CGC.

The Obedience Masters title requires that a dog accumulate 200 points from Open B and Utility B. The point schedule is a sliding scale that runs from 6 points for a score of 190 to 15 points for a 197 and above.

This is the second time Chase has achieved this level, and I am so proud of him!









Solving the Mysteries in the Training Processes....

It would be nice to think that once a dog is trained to perform the exercises in a specific venue, doing those exercises would be the proverbial piece of cake – but dogs are living breathing animals and that, in itself, makes the whole process a challenge.

Part of the training/trialing process in any dog sport is the art of critical observation. You've got to be able to look at something that goes wrong and decide if it's a training issue, an environmental issue or a health issue.

This is a vitally important part of the process.

Not understanding the cause of the breakdown of an exercise just adds to the confusion on the dog's part and frustration on the part of the handler. For instance, if a dog is feeling some pain during the act of jumping, no training method is going to increase the likelihood of the dog successfully jumping.

Here are two examples of this – and the first from agility training.

Somewhere in the course of Chase's agility classes, he began to jump off the up-ramp on the dog walk. We speculated it was because this specific dog walk had some give to it, and several other things, but we didn't solve the problem until the instructor stood on one side of the up-ramp and I stood on the other. Our actual purpose for doing this was to keep Chase from making the decision to go off – but then we observed something very interesting – and not what we expected.

Chase runs the dog walk with his head down, and I was running him during training with a grab tab. As he went up the ramp, the grab tab was just long enough that when he dropped his head, he was stepping on it with his front paw – and that was pulling him off.

We removed the grab tab – and he went over that dog walk again and again and again without problems.

Obedience – a couple of weeks ago we made our first venture into the UKC Utility ring after taking some months off to do some other stuff. As anyone who does obedience will tell you, the UKC Utility class is just about the hardest class in all the registries, including the AKC.

Knowing this, Chase had been well trained and well proofed for this – so imagine my shock when he NQ'd in both days in both trials – a total of 4 NQ's in a row! Now, I've got to say that Chase is extremely consistent; yes, he'll blow an exercise and a class, but he doesn't blow 4 classes in a row and not a different exercise in each class.

So the observation part of this comes into play to solve the mystery.

He's very familiar with the trial site, so it's not environmental. There was absolutely nothing different that would have caused his attention to wander that badly.

It was a different exercise in each class, so it's not likely a training issue. The rule of thumb with obedience training is if a dog does something wrong the first time, that's OK. If he does it a second time, it needs to be fixed right then (generally by backtracking and making sure the dog understands each component of the exercise). You don't want the dog to do the same thing wrong three times, because by then, it's become a habit.

This left a health problem. So what was wrong?

It's not illness, because his attitude is great, he's happy, eating well, etc. He's moving well with no signs of soreness.

The exercises he blew were the signal glove, the marked glove, one directed jumping and one signal. Since only one of these is a jumping exercise, it's not his hips or back. And since he was blowing them before he needed to do any turns, it's not likely to be his back.

OK, what is the common link? Three of the exercises all involved actions to be done in the ring on the left side of Chase's body. And upon thinking about the signal exercise, I realized that while he was in the down position, he looked away from me, turning the left side of his head toward me. Chase is trained and proofed enough to have picked the signal up with his peripheral vision; but he didn't.

And that was the final piece of the mystery!

A trip to the vet's the next day confirmed that he had an ulcer in the left eye; probably from chasing the rabbits and the squirrels into our hedgerow.

The eye has healed nicely, and he's back in good form without any ill effects.

It would have been great if Chase could have come to me, put a paw on my lap, and said "Mom, I'm not seeing well out of this eye, and it hurts", but he couldn't. He didn't even rub his eye or indicate in any way that he was in physical pain – he tried his best in spite of the eye and told me the only way he could that something was not right – and it's my responsibility to watch for those signs.

I hope these examples help clarify the need to examine exactly what happens when a dog does not perform as expected. It's essential to get to the root problem before trying to fix the behavior.

I've found that the need for good observation when something goes wrong is one of the hardest things to teach beginning trainers in any sport, but it's essential to develop it. These great companions of our have limited means of communication to us; it's our responsibility to make sure what they communicate is interpreted correctly.
