



SYDNEY, PRIVATE INVESTIGATOR





This is a (still) photo of **Sydney** from our movie,

"The Theft of the Rothchild Ruby."

In this scene, Sydney opens a step peddle wastebasket &
Retrieves a vital piece of evidence.

The sequence of behaviors Sydney had to do in one shot was:

- 1) Orient to the wastebasket and lie down,
- 2) Put one foot on the peddle and hold it down to open the lid,
- 3) Still holding the peddle down (or the lid would slam shut) stand up and get a wadded-up piece of paper out of the wastebasket,
- 4) Take her foot off the peddle and drop the paper on the floor (in order to smooth it out and read it).

My challenge in beginning to teach this chain of behaviors was that I saw when Sydney stood in front of the wastebasket and put her foot on the peddle, the lid flipped up under her chin (sort of like her receiving a stiff upper cut). So, I had her lie down in front of the wastebasket and target the peddle with her foot. This allowed the lid to open before she was near it. It took a bit of time to get Sydney to hold the peddle down with one foot while she stood up and got the paper out, but I was really pleased how quickly she caught on to what was expected.

We had so much fun making this movie. We hope you enjoy it too.





PRACTICAL POODLE POSTSCRIPT.....

Holiday Dangers to consider....

Holidays can create dangers for your poodles. It's a busy time ... a time of much planning, shopping, cooking and baking, rushing to and from parties and gettogethers with relatives and friends. Oftentimes we forget about our little four-legged members of the family during the rush and festivities. Each year during the various holiday seasons, some pets are seriously injured and/or become deathly ill. Our Poodles are very curious and there are often times many hazards waiting for their curiosity.



Holiday Safety Tips for Poodle owners:

Christmas....The foil wraps on candies can cause internal injuries if swallowed . Keep all candies and their wrappers in a secured place.

Other holiday treats, alcoholic beverages, rich, fatty food scraps and bones can be harmful or toxic to pets. Keep your poodle on his regular diet and caution visitors against giving your poodle "special treats."

Supervise all candles - pets are attracted to the bright "lights" in a darkened room. Not only could they receive serious burns, but they could knock the candles over, spilling hot wax onto furniture and carpeting. Don't leave candles unattended for their sake and for the obvious fire hazards.

All other decorations should be carefully placed so that your poodle can't pull or scratch off any small pieces to swallow.

Cover or tack down electrical cords.

New Year's can bring hazards such as from fun noise-makers and confetti which could very easily pose a serious threat to your poodles' sense of well-being and health. Noise-makers can frighten your poodle causing the it to bolt out an open door window, or leap to a precarious area in search of safety. Confetti can be ingested, wreaking havoc to the digestive tract.

Caution: Those adorable holiday costumes may be cute at get-togethers or in family photos, but poodle owners be wary of costumes which have rubber bands to keep them securely in place. If rubber bands are accidently left on after the fun of dressing up is over, your poodle could chew off and swallow them, causing choking and/or intestinal injuries.

It is also important to consider whether increased activity and visitors during the winter holiday season may upset your poodle's routine. Try to keep your poodle on his regular schedule for feeding and exercise during this busy time of the year.

If you are planning to take your poodle with you when visiting friends and relatives during the holidays, be sure to contact them in advance to find out if your pet is welcome.
